Conant High School will be offering the Preliminary SAT/ National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) on Wednesday, October 11, 2017.

- Do NOT use this test as a practice for the SAT. All juniors will be offered the opportunity to take a free, practice SAT in school on Wednesday, October 11, 2017.
- The NMSQT is the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test for the National Merit Scholarship Program. Historically, approximately only one half of one percent of the students who take this test score high enough to receive this award. This is a prestigious honor among high school students, which may bring financial rewards in the form of scholarship money for college.

Registration Begins Online **Monday, September 11, 2017**
Registration Ends and Payment Due **Monday, September 18, 2017**

After registering, print the confirmation page PDF and bring along with payment to the CHS Main Office during regular school hours by **Monday, September 18, 2017**. Payments will only be accepted at school by cash, check, cashier's check, or money order. Please make checks payable to Conant High School. If payment is not made by Monday, September 18th, your test will be cancelled. There are NO refunds for the PSAT.

Students should report to the North Gym by 7:30am on Wednesday, October 11, 2017 with #2 pencils (no mechanical pencils), an approved calculator and Student ID. An email reminder will be sent to students prior to the testing day.

The PSAT/NMSQT results will be available online through student College Board accounts in December. If a student account has not already been created, please visit [Create College Board Account](#). The scores provide a basis for early estimates of a student's probable performance on the College Board's SAT Test, which is used for admission to colleges and universities.
